About this Location

Located directly across from the Ballston-MU Metrorail station, this mixed-use project will bring 144 affordable apartments to Ballston where residents will have ample access to transit, retail, and employment opportunities.

History

In 2015, Central United Methodist Church (CUMC) started a process to redevelop their aging church property into affordable housing. In 2020, APAH and CUMC entered into partnership to fulfill the congregation's wishes. Construction is expected to be completed in spring, 2024.

Building and Apartment Features

APAH will develop the site into 144 units of affordable housing, a 26,699sf condo for CUMC and community amenities including a commercial kitchen for onsite food distribution, a meeting hall, and an early childhood education space to accommodate approximately 90 children.


